rtist Diane Thornton lives in Southern California, where she works primarily in watercolor and ink, focusing on tropical and botanical themes. "Having lived in Hawaii" she says, "many of my paintings reflect my time there."

She started as a typesetter in commercial printing, then office support for WJLA-TV in Washington, DC, and the Los Angeles Times bureau there. A 26-year stopover in the SF Bay Area followed, where she returned to type and design, running a successful graphic design business that served Silicon Valley

corporations and local government. After closing her design firm, it was a stint as Associate Art Director for Stanford magazine where she found her true calling: illustration. And once that illustration bug hit, there was no looking back. Today, you can find the playful style of her illustrations reflected in her fine art.

"I'm not much for expounding on my art as commentary or serious reflection of this or that," she says. "I simply make art that makes me happy. When it makes other people happy, that makes me even happier."

The other creative hat Ms. Thornton wears is that of author. Her books, Scrap City (middle-grade fantasy; Capstone Young Readers), and Marvin Plotnik and the Sandy Rivers Hilltop Ranch for Wayward Youth, Juveniles, and Young Adults (sci-fi humor, Monkeypod Publishing) have received much acclaim.


